### THE CARMEN'S TRANSPORT ENVIRONMENTAL AWARD

*...recognises a measurably significant project which helps to create a cleaner, quieter, healthier or aesthetically more pleasing transport environment, while facilitating the safe and efficient movement of people or goods in the United Kingdom over the past two years.*

Founded in 2003, it comprises a shield, with the winner's name engraved, held for one year, and this citation.
